

OUTSTANDING PROJECT AWARD Requirements and Criteria

PURPOSE:

To recognize an outstanding project, research, or other significant contribution to Delaware and southern Chester County, PA

ELIGIBILITY

Project must:

- Be substantially completed during the year of the call for nominations or within a reasonable recent time period. Projects that are a major renovation, upgrade, expansion, etc. of an existing facility are eligible and will be evaluated based on the new work. Innovative programs are also eligible.
- The project or program must be physically located in **Delaware County or southern Chester County**.

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

Each entry will be evaluated based on the following five categories, which are key elements of the project description text required in the electronic submittal described below.

1. Uniqueness and/or innovative applications of new or existing techniques 20%2. Future value to the engineering profession and perception by the public 20%3. Social, economic and sustainable development considerations20%4. Complexity20%5. Successful fulfillment of client/owner needs20%Total

The selected project will be honored at the Chapter's **February 22, 2024** Engineers Week Banquet. Award-Winning Project Principals should plan on a presentation not to exceed (10) minutes during the Banquet.

Present technical information in lay terms. Judges may not have expertise in the particular engineering discipline of the project.
